Before using any product, familiarise yourself with all safety and first aid instructions on the Safety Data Sheet (SDS).

RESPECT

Always handle all chemicals and cleaning solutions with care, even if they are non-hazardous, natural, or claimed to be chemical-free. Before use, ensure you read the label, training guide, and Safety Data Sheet (SDS). Be familiar with where these documents are stored and refer to them regularly.



DO NOT MIX

Do not mix chemicals together, as this can result in serious injury or even death. Never "top up" bottles, as this may lead to crosscontamination and the possibility of mixing chemicals incorrectly. Always use clean, empty containers when refilling.



KNOW PRODUCT

WEAR PPE



Familiarise yourself with the colour, characteristics, and safety instructions of the products you use.



- Know where the SDS is located
- Go through the SDS
- Inform and share with your colleagues



PROPER LABEL

Always report any damaged or unreadable labels to your supervisor. Verify that the bottle contains the correct product and is properly labelled. Replace any labels that are damaged or illegible.



UNSURE? STOP!



See your supervisor immediately and refer to the relevant documents.

Avoid splashes at all times. Always wear gloves and the necessary personal protective equipment as specified on the SDS. Gloves must be worn when handling chemicals, disposing of waste, cleaning toilets, cleaning up body fluids, and whenever instructed by your supervisor.
